Kitimat Arts for Youth - \$6,000



Funds will be used for maintenance of band instruments, supports for Theatre camp and instrument clinics.

Kitimat Community Development - \$21,680



Funds will be used for furniture, toys and food support for the daycares and programming.

Kitimat Understanding the Environment - \$10,000



Funds will be used for education and awareness campaigns on the benefits of recycling.

Kitimat Museum & Archives - \$3,250



Funds will be used for Museum in the Classroom Art Workshops, Museum Explorer programs, exhibition case cover and labeling for Haisla Heritage area.

Special Olympics - BC, Kitimat - \$1,000



Funds will be used for Athletes to access sports venues.
